He was an active member of McFarland United Methodist Church. He was a member of the Walker County Retired Educators Association and the Fellowship of Christian Athletes Coaching Association. He is survived by his wife of forty-six years: Barbara Jean Haire Leonard, their son: Ben Leonard both of Rossville, GA, niece: Laura Carroll, nephews: Doug Carroll, Darryl and Gary Hardy.
