Andrew "Jack" Jackson Kittle, 78, of Ringgold, Georgia passed away Monday August 26, 2013 at his residence. A lifelong resident of the Ringgold area, Jack was a retired Veteran of the U.S. Army where he served as a U.S. Airborne Ranger Instructor, serving in the Korean and Vietnam Wars. He was a retired employee of Whealand Foundary where he worked for 23 years, a member of the U.S. Army Marksmanship Unit of Ft. Gordon, the American Legion and the NRA.
