Charles “Chuck” Snyder Dunn III age 52, of Rock Spring, Georgia passed away Thursday – March 13, 2025. Chuck was born in Fort Oglethorpe, Georgia to the late Charles Snyder Dunn, Jr. and Martha Quinn Dunn. He graduated LaFayette High School – Class of 1990. He furthered his education at Auburn University where he graduated with his major in English and a minor in history, GO WAR EAGLES! Chuck served his country in the U.S. Navy and was a proud veteran. He began his law enforcement career with the Walker County Sheriff’s Department and he served in Kosovo with DynaCorp as an International Police Officer. Chuck grew up in the Rock Spring area and was a longtime member of Center Grove Baptist Church. He loved studying history and helping dogs and cats being relocated with their owners and rescued many. Chuck was currently serving with the Chickamauga Police Department, where the town had adopted him as one of their own. Serving for the past fifteen years in Chickamauga, the community, students, business owners, members of Elizabeth Lee Methodist Church where he directed traffic often on Sunday mornings, loved Chuck dearly. Chuck is survived by his adopted brother: Billy (Kim) Mullis, their daughters, Chuck’s goddaughters: Brandy and Kiera Mullis all of Lafayette, Georgia and many brothers and sisters in blue. “ When I first came to The Sheriff's office back in 1999, Chuck and I were shift mates. I never will forget listening to him speak on anything concerning history. I learned a lot about history from Chuck that I was unwilling to learn in High School. I remember one night when Chuck and I were patrolling A sector (north end of the county). I received a call concerning a large party of intoxicated subjects at a house on a certain road which was a nuisance to the complainant. Chuck was tied up on another call at the time, so I went to the call by myself. Upon arrival, I observed a large crowd of 80 to 100 individuals, most of which were non English speaking and extremely intoxicated. I observed several vehicles which were actively participating in what appeared to be a demolition derby type activity (crashing into one another). I exited my patrol car and noticed there were several people fighting in another area. I notified dispatch that I needed back up 10-18 (emergency). I proceeded to move toward the fight in progress, but when they saw me, they stopped fighting. The people there were none too thrilled that I was there and many of them started walking toward me. I attempted to create dialogue with anyone who could understand. No one appeared to understand and even was willing to communicate. It was at this point I started to sense them surrounding me. I started getting that funny feeling in my sixth sense telling me something was about to happen. I reported this to dispatch and continued to observe their actions. They continued to move toward me so i reached for my pepper spray about at the precise time that I heard a siren really close. The crowd appeared distracted by the siren and did not continue toward me. Then appears good ole Chuck coming in sideways in his patrol car. It comes to a stop while a cloud of dust filled the air. Chuck stepped up on the threshold of the drivers side with his AR-15 leaning on the top of his patrol car and had laser dot on the people closest to me. He shouted with a loud commanding voice, " The first one that touches him is a dead man. It was at this time that I learned how many among them comprehended English.
