When I was really young, we would always stay the night at her house, watching movies and getting into trouble. In the summer, we would pick blueberries from her bushes and eat freeze pops from a stash she always kept full for us. In the winter, she would always buy us Christmas presents, and we would open them at her always-cozy house alongside her dog: Prissy. Mamaw's phone number was the second phone number I ever memorized after our own, and we were instructed to call her in case of emergencies.

One time, Papaw was about to give us a good whoopin' after straight-up disobeying his instructions by riding our bikes too far (he suspected us and caught us in the act!). But Mamaw came and saved the day by intervening right before our punishment came. Another fond memory I have is that, every so often, she would indulge us and play "Monster". We kids would hide (in the most obvious places) and she would pretend to be the monster coming to get us! It really meant a lot that she would take time out of her busy schedule to play with us. But that's just how she was!

Recalling fragments of memories like: the donkey she and Papaw had (aptly named Donk), the birthday parties she always threw for Papaw, the innumerable meals she made for us, putting up with our shenanigans (and cleaning up after us too), and her involvement in all-things-church-related will always be dear memories to me. Mamaw was truly a larger-than-life presence, and I can only hope to live in a way that does justice to her memory and excellence of character. Rest in Peace, Mamaw.
