James Lynn Cutcher 69, of Ringgold GA went to be with The Lord on December 31, 2020. Born in Ducktown, TN to the late Abe & Margaret Cutcher at 3.41 lbs; he received private duty care “until he gained weight”. He graduated from Baylor High School; and attended the University of Tennessee Knoxville that started his lifelong love for the Tennessee Vols. Jim later moved back to Chattanooga to complete his EMT and Paramedic license. He then returned to Ducktown, TN to start Polk County Ambulance Service. In 1978 Jim and his brother Rick moved back to Chattanooga and he began working at the new ambulance service at Hutcheson Medical Center along with several other ambulance services for the state of Georgia. He later taught EMSD Paramedic students at Chattanooga State Community College. Jim was passionate about his patients and provided the upmost care. He established deep friendships with both patients, staff, colleagues, and students. He was ‘Highly’ respected and revered; and stood for the highest ethical standards in EMS Care.

He was a member of Good Shepherd Lutheran Church, loved The Lord, and served on many committees. He shared God’s love by going to see the shut-in, and sharing God’s Word with them.

He is survived by his loving wife of 41 years Joan Beaver Cutcher; his two children Dabney (Robert) Padgett and Corey (Savanna) Cutcher, both of Chattanooga; also surviving are four grandchildren Lena & Eloise Cutcher and Briggs & Pace Padgett; brother Rick (Diane) Cutcher; niece and nephew

Adam & Cortney.

The family will receive friends on Tuesday January 5, 2021 in the parlor of the funeral home from 4:00 – 8:00 p.m. A funeral service will be held at 2:00 p.m. Wednesday January 6, 2021 in the Ft.
