After his time in the Army, Logan worked for thirty-four years at the Georgia Department of Corrections, where he served as the Warden at several state prisons, including Walker State Prison in Rock Spring, Georgia. In his early years, he enjoyed woodworking and building things with his hands and he was a Mason. He was a proud Georgia Bulldogs and Atlanta Falcons fan. He always enjoyed watching them play. Logan was a brilliant man of integrity and character. If he said it, he meant it. He treated everyone equally and with kindness and compassion. Most of all, Logan was a godly man who loved the Lord and his family. He was a fantastic husband, father, and grandfather, and he enjoyed every moment he spent with his family. Logan was dearly loved by his family and all who knew him. He will be greatly missed.

Logan was preceded in death by his parents, James Calvin and Elizabeth Doris Lanier, and his brothers, Daniel Lanier and William Lanier.

“ I'm rarely at a loss of words but ever since I found out Hospice was called for him, I've just been numb. Tonight I finally feel I can articulate my thoughts. It's been around 17 years since I've seen him but he is part of who I am today. Mr. Lanier was the first Deputy Warden who believed in my abilities as the Key and Tool Control Officer at Walker State Prison. He had more faith in me than I had in myself. He was an amazing Deputy Warden and then Warden. As I promoted up the ranks, under his leadership, he would take time to give me advice, good solid advice. The advice I remember to this day is; "Inmates are like a stream of water, they will follow the route of least resistance." Very true. One of my favorite memories was when the Store Lady, Allison Swearengin called me on the phone to tell me it appeared that the kitchen inmates were fixing to sneak a huge amount of contraband from the kitchen through the tray return window. The store window faced the kitchen. I told her I was going to go to the Laundry hallway and for her to call me when they handed the items off. I hung up and called Mr. Lanier because we were short staffed. He was all over this. As soon as I hung up Swearengin called and told me to hurry. These inmates didn't know what hit them. Staff was coming from every direction! Lol. They had used all the spaghetti hamburger meat to make hundreds of hamburgers! When all was said and done every inmate working the kitchen was locked down and a new kitchen crew installed. Lol. He was pretty freaking awesome. He was probably the only Warden who could chew me out and I'd leave his office thanking him. Lol. One day, as I was leaving his office from one of those sessions, I stopped at the door and turned around and said, "How do you do that? Chew me out and I leave like I won a prize. There is one thing I want to say to Tina there was no doubt of his love for you. You rocked his world. He was so proud of you! He bragged on you all the time to me. After I transferred to Hays State Prison and I'd talk to Tina I would always ask how he was doing. I was so excited when She told me he had given his life to Christ. Yea, I'm a much better person from having known James Logan Lanier. Much better. Hey Warden, I'll see you on the other side of my last earthly breath, you can bank on that!! I'm so sorry I can't make it down for the

service. Funds are short and the roads are horrible in Northern Wisconsin. All my love and prayers go out to the family.
