John Henry Tippins, Jr. known by friends and family as Johnny Tippins, 83, of Ringgold, Georgia went home to be with the Lord on December 10, 2013. He was born in Gadsden, Alabama to the late John Henry Tippins, Sr and Thelma King Tippins. He was an Eagle Scout, a lifeguard and an accomplished athlete before entering college. Johnny attended college at Athens College in Athens, Alabama before serving in the Navy during the Korean War. After his service, he returned to college and completed his Masters Degree at Peabody Teachers College in Nashville.

He was married for 61 glorious years to the late Inez Willis Tippins.

Johnny's career was one of service to all the young people he encountered. He shared his love of sports and sportsmanship with everyone he met. He was a teacher, a football coach, a baseball coach, a Sunday School teacher, and a friend to many of the high school students he taught. From his first position at Hokes Bluff High School in Gadsden, Alabama to his last position at Lakeview-Fort Oglethorpe High School, he did his best to instill the values of hard work, teamwork and compassion with all of his students!

After retiring in Catoosa County from the education field, Johnny continued serving his church, Boynton United Methodist Church and his community through the Boynton Lions Club. Throughout all of his life, though, Johnny never wanted accolades for himself.
