He graduated in the top 10 percent from Gordon Lee Memorial High School in 2005. He was scheduled to graduate with a bachelor degree in 2015 from Dalton State. Josh worked at Humbuckers in Ringgold, as the Internet sales manager. He was an intelligent, polite, generous young man who will be missed by all. The world was blessed by the birth of Josh Bates on Oct. 13, 1986. He brought joy and a smile to all he encountered. He loved Christian music, played the guitar and also taught music lessons. He played music at local venues and local churches. He was a good listener and a good friend to all who knew him. He was an angel on earth. He will be playing music among angels now.
