He enjoyed playing golf and flying his Beech Bonanzas. He was an avid NASCAR fan and football fan, except for the Tennessee Volunteers. He was the builder and owner of a 1976 Kenworth W900 which held the World's Fastest Stock Heavy-Duty Diesel Truck Land Speed Record set in Salt Lake City Flats – named the "Liberty Bell".
