



## Mr. Larry "Smokey" Edward Caldwell

March 13, 1941 - March 12, 2022

Larry "Smokey" Edward Caldwell age 80, passed away Saturday - March 12, 2022. He was born in Dalton, Georgia to the late Edward Franklin Caldwell and Martha Hazel Edwards Caldwell. Smokey had many layers to his life and had resided in the LaFayette area for the past sixty years. He served his country for six years in the U.S. Navy as a Gunners Mate. He excelled in a career with the Georgia Forestry Commission including fire-fighting, leading and teaching rescue. This took him across the United States. During those years he also was a foster parent, Sunday school teacher, had an upholstery shop and enjoyed caving. As a former Walker County Rescue Chief in 1976 he developed a safer rope for Rescuers and Cavers and founded Pigeon Mountain Industries. This grew with partners into PMI Rope Company in LaFayette, Georgia that still operates today. Smokey was a cave explorer with several discoveries and rescues all over the world to his credit. He assisted in mapping 37 miles of Mammoth Caves and lead the mapping of Ellison's Cave. In 1992 he went to work for Voice of America, the U.S. Government International Radio Network, where he taught radio tower riggers rope safety around the world. Smokey's next vision was to develop the event venue known as Cherokee Farms in Mineral Springs, which will continue to operate. He was of the Baptist faith, a member of the National Speological Society and humbly donated to all branches of the Walker County First Responders. Along with his parents, he is preceded in death by his step-father: Hoke Miolen, brother and sister-in-law: Lloyd (Patricia) Caldwell and nephew: Larry

Caldwell. He is survived by his daughter: Kimberly (William) McNeese of Cleveland, TN, caring companion: Debbie Yancey, brothers: Kenneth (Judy) Caldwell, Steve Miolen, Chris Miolen, sisters: Lyonne Walker, Rita (Phil) Miolen, grandchildren: Jessica Jean and Jesse Andrew McNeese, nieces and nephews: Joy (Ladane) Caldwell Miles, Kenneth "Casey" (Anna) Caldwell, Eddie Caldwell, Doug Caldwell, Rob Walker, Paul (Alecia) Walker, extended family and many special friends to be the keepers of his legacy.
