Margaret Rebecca Dykes Baker, 98, of Dalton, went to be with her Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ, on Tuesday, June 09, 2015. She is preceded in death by her loving husband of 42 years, Holdman Baker, parents, William Franklin and Susie Mae Dykes, brother, Malcolm Dykes, sister, Julia Smith, and brother, Joe Dykes. She will be greatly missed by her daughters, Beth Small, Maryville, Tennessee, and Nancy Vickery, Dalton, Georgia, her grandson, Joshua Small, Maryville, Tennessee, his wife, Kelsey, and her great-grandsons, Hunter and Mason. Survivors also include several nieces and nephews and their children. She will also be greatly missed by the compassionate staff at Southern Haven Assisted Living in Dalton.

Margaret was born in rural Bullock County, Alabama, and she loved growing up on a farm. She graduated from Auburn University in 1942 with a B.S. degree in nutrition and dietetics, and she graduated from the University of Tennessee in 1946 with a Masters in nutrition and institution management. She taught at the college level at Tennessee Tech and the University of Georgia, and at the high school level at Calhoun City Schools and Gordon Lee High School in Chickamauga. Margaret remained an avid Auburn fan, still attending games when she was 96.

She was a member of Chickamauga Presbyterian Church, where she also served as an Elder, Deacon, and Sunday School teacher. She was elected

Elder Emeritus in 2004. After 35 years in the Chickamauga church, she moved to Dalton to be closer to her daughter, Nancy. She was an associate member and a faithful volunteer for the First Presbyterian Church of Dalton.

Services will be Friday at 2 p.m. at Chickamauga Presbyterian Church with the Rev. Edward C. Langham Jr. and the Rev. Bridget Waddell officiating. Interment will follow in the Chickamauga City Cemetery. The family will receive friends Thursday from 5 to 8 pm at the funeral home.
