Raymond Clayton Murray Sr., 93 of Chattanooga passed away in his home, surrounded by family on August 29, 2020. Mr. Murray is of the Presbyterian faith. Raymond was a quiet man, but his actions spoke volumes.

He served his country in the Army Air Force where he was deployed to Japan during World War II. He was an intelligence officer at the Yokota Air Base, and retired from the National Guard after 31 years. Mr. Murray was also a retired United States Postal Carrier, and previously was involved with the Masons, the VFW, Parent Teacher Association and the Lookout Valley Recreation Association.

He is preceded in death by his wife, Hattie Elizabeth Shetters Murray; his parents Raymond Joseph James Murray, and Bessie May Lowe Murray; his grandmother Amanda Morgan Lowe; and his brother Harold James Murray.
