As time went on, I became estranged from my family. But I still came to see my mamaw every possible chance i got. Ive snuck in to her room many times when no one even knew. We'd lay in bed together and watch TV land. Eat little Debbies. I would wheel around the house or outside to get some fressh air. And no matter

how much time past. It was as if time as limitless. She was ALWAYS happy to see me.
